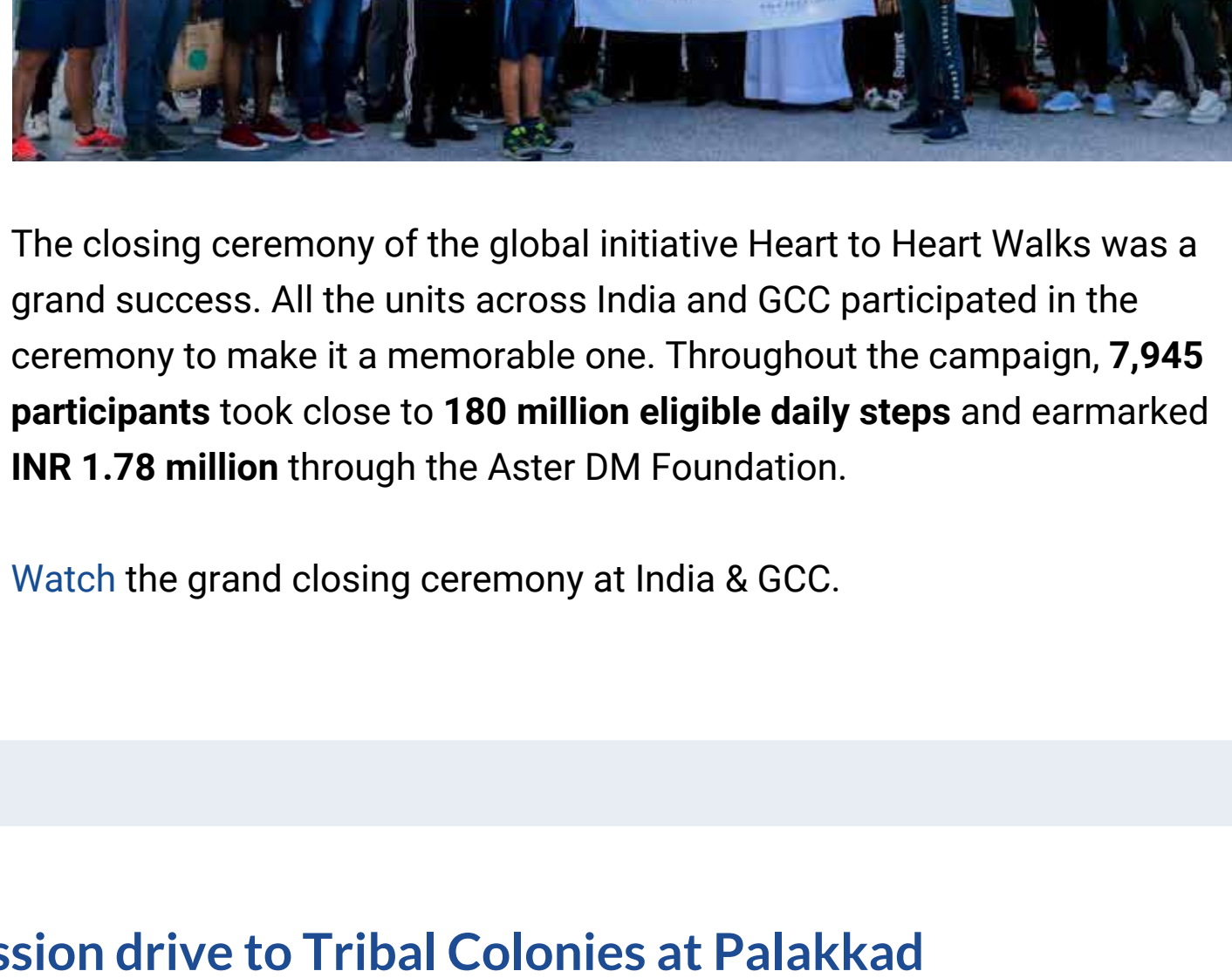




Heart to Heart Walks 2022- Closing ceremony

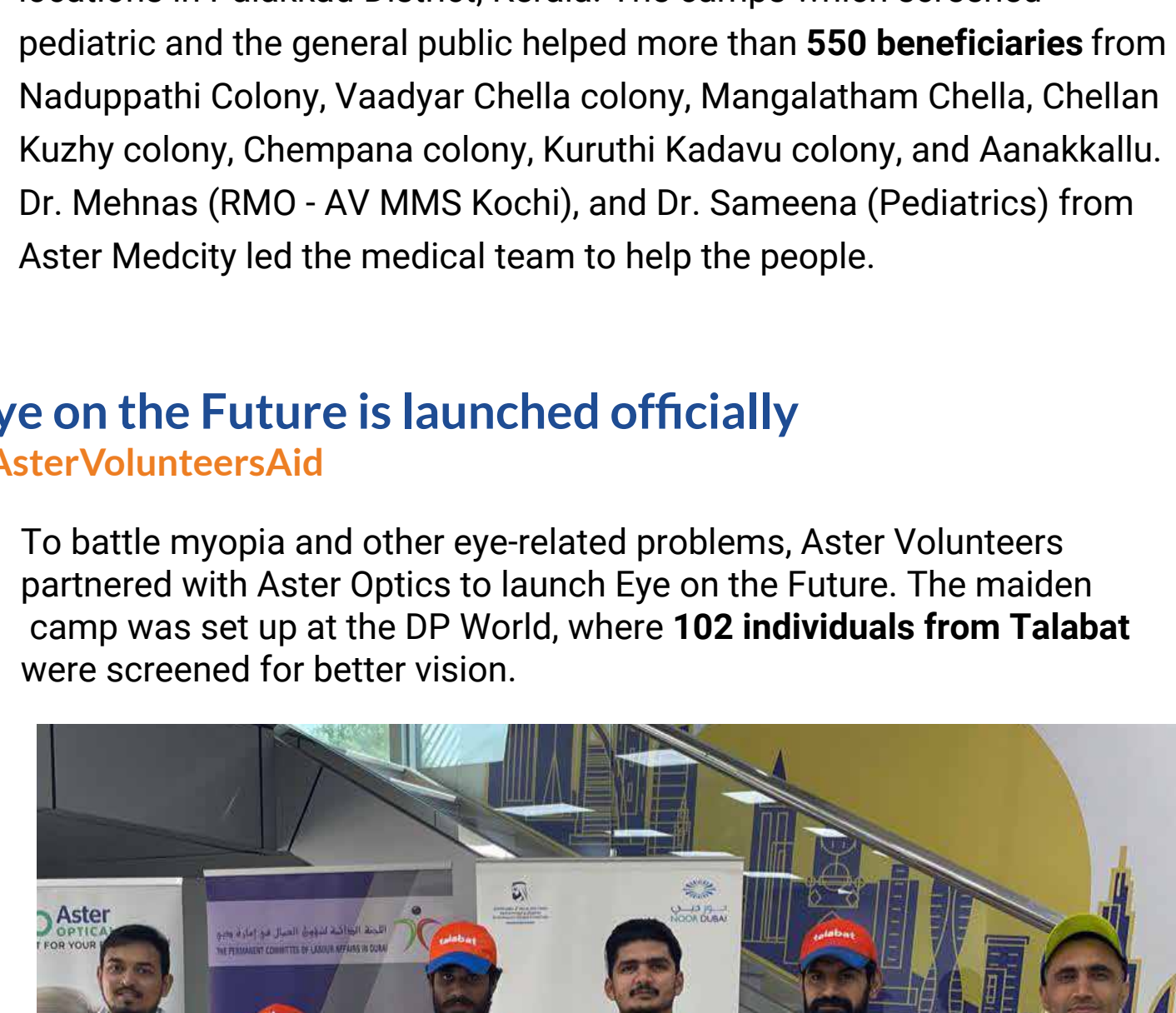

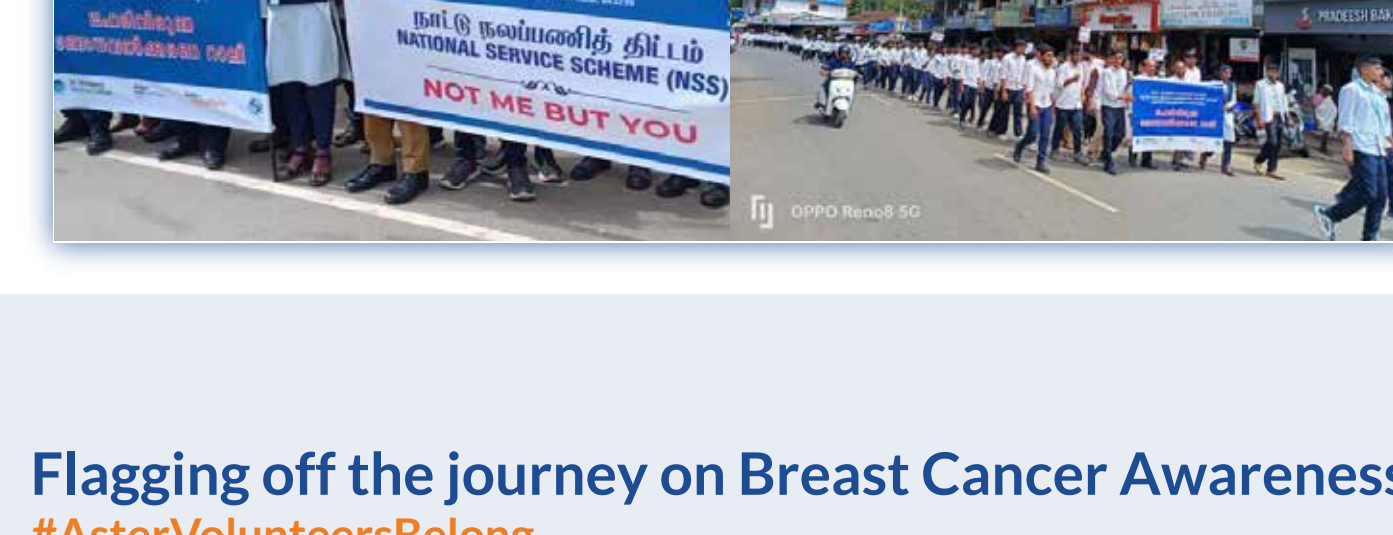
Reaching the unreached

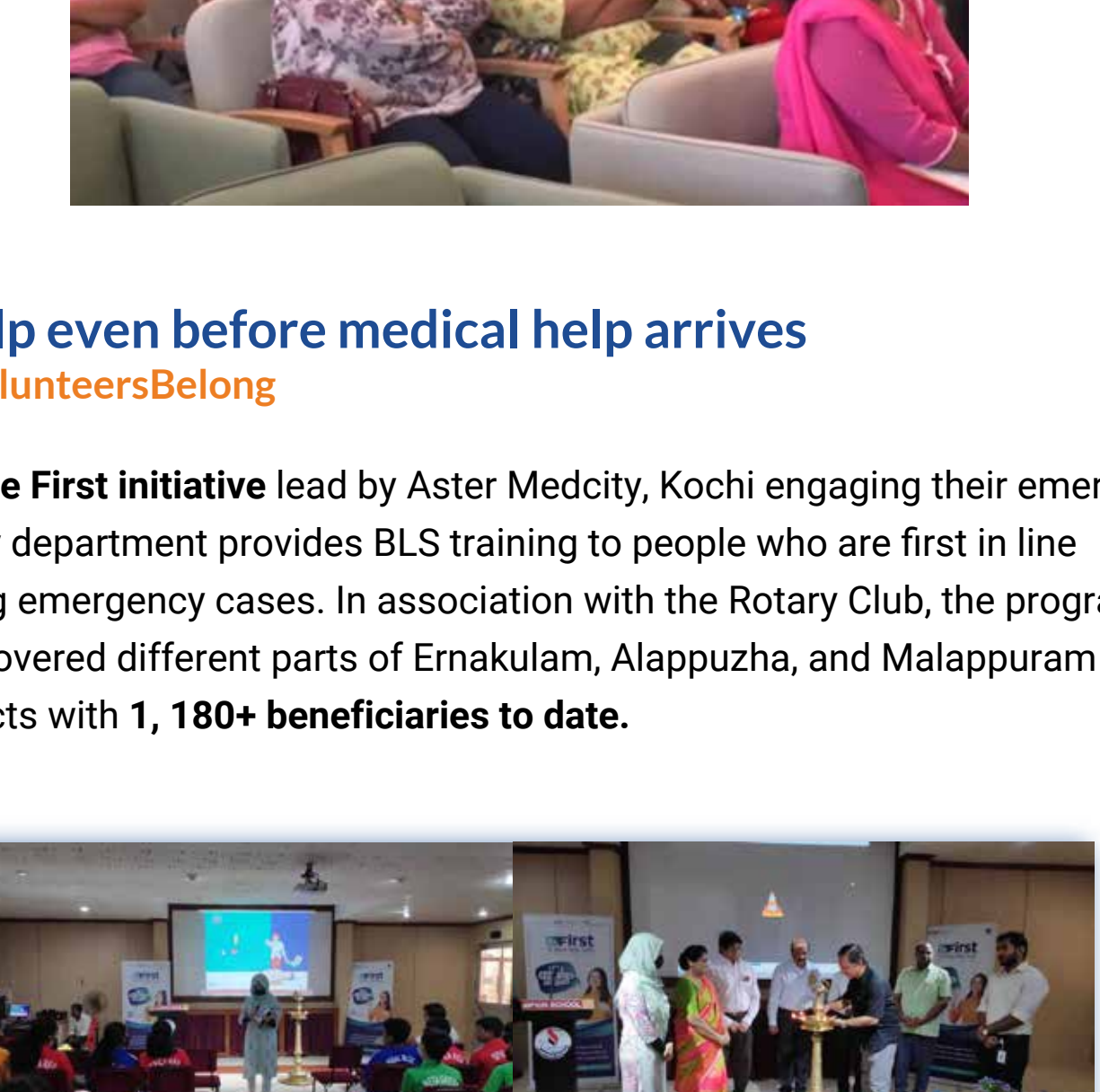

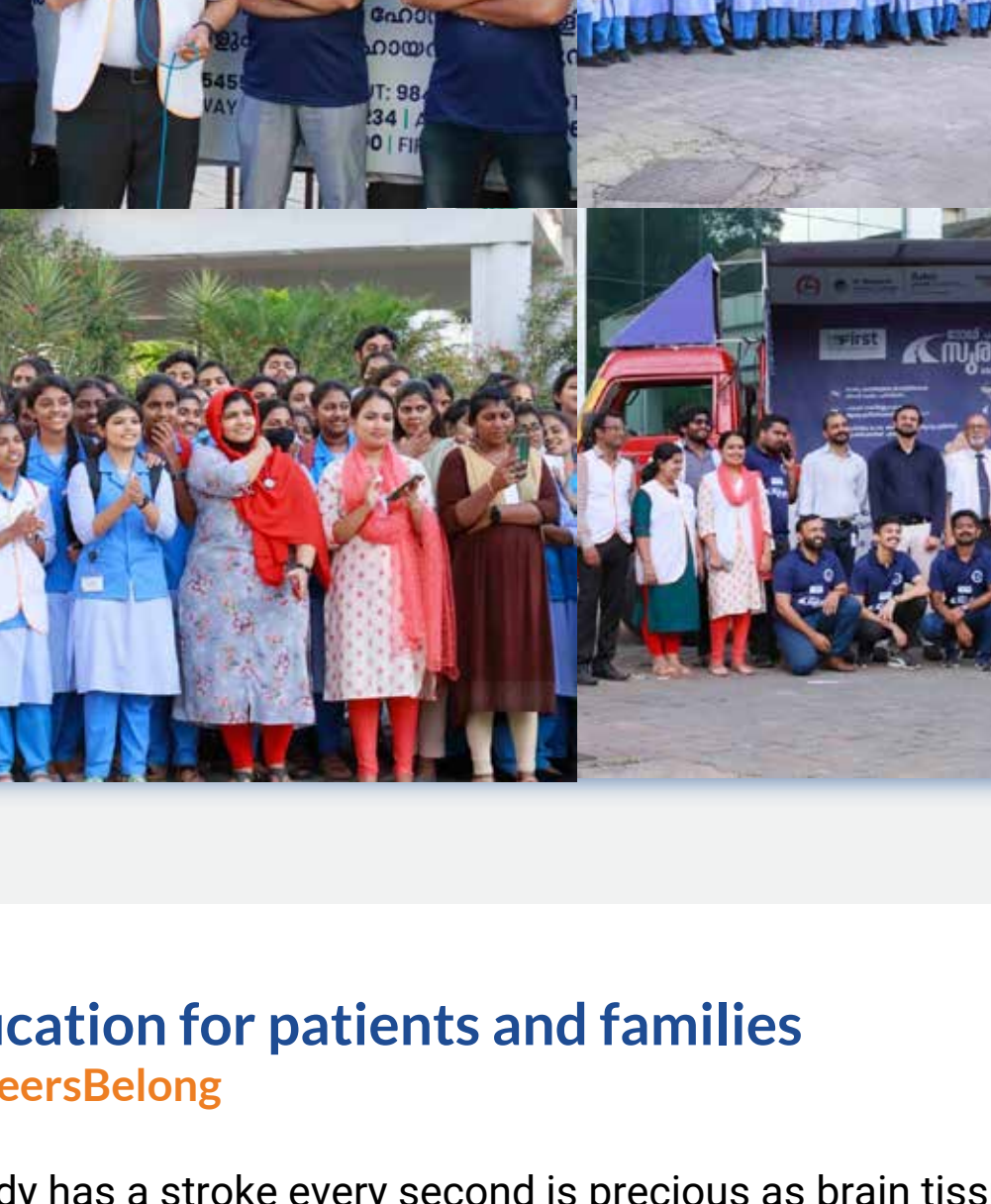
