



Aster Volunteers UAE, in partnership with Abu Dhabi 4x4, and with the support of BEEAH and Sharjah Police, conducted its 5th annual desert clean-up drive 2026, at the Badayar Military Area, Al Badayar Desert, Sharjah. The drive brought together over 110 volunteers, supported by 50 off-road 4x4 vehicle enthusiasts, who worked tirelessly to remove plastic waste and other pollutants threatening the desert ecosystem.

The improperly discarded waste polluting the desert was collected carefully and segregated and handed over to BEEAH Tandeef, our sustainable waste management partner, ensuring responsible processing and disposal.


The program involves the complete lifecycle of urban farming, from seed to harvest, cultivating fresh organic produce for consumption and a healthier environment.




Aster Volunteers continues to bridge healthcare gaps by delivering essential healthcare services to the communities that need them most through the Medical and Wellness initiative. From preventive screenings to specialized consultations, each camp reflects the commitment to making quality healthcare accessible, inclusive, and compassionate for all.

Qatar

Aster Volunteers from Qatar extended their healthcare services with 9 camps, offering first aid support at major public events along with preventive health screenings and awareness programs, such as on-site emergency care, diagnostic screenings, (BP, BMI, and GRBS), and focused health awareness sessions. The initiatives collectively reached over 1,600 beneficiaries in the month of January and February 2026 across communities, workplace, and public event settings.

The outreach included a 10-day safety vigil at the National Kite Festival, health screening camps at Kahramaa offices, and a Mega Medical Camp for the Al Khor community on Qatar National Sports Day. Additional initiatives comprised a health awareness session for children and caregivers at Daffodils Nursery, a health screening camp for Dolphin Energy workers in Al Khor, and first aid support at the QSFA Ramadan Running Challenge at Education City.

A community health screening camp in collaboration with the Ministry of Interior on Qatar National Sports Day was also conducted. The outreach further featured a women's health awareness session for the Telangana Association in Al Hilal, led by Dr. Srilaxmi Ramachandran, Specialist Obstetrician and Gynaecologist at Aster Hospital Al Hilal, strengthening preventive health education.

Oman

Aster Volunteers from Oman extended their healthcare services through 9 camps, clinical outreach programs, medical check-up camps, and specialized training symposiums, impacting over 1,385 beneficiaries in the month of January and February 2026. This comprehensive initiative spanned major cultural landmarks, government ministries, and industrial sites, providing essential healthcare services and professional medical education where they were needed most.



Aster Volunteers from Aster Royal Al Raffah Hospital provided a full month of first aid and basic health check-ups for 432 visitors at the Muscat Nights Festival.



Aster Volunteers from Oman provided basic check-ups and GP consultations to 127 employees of the Ministry of Housing.



Aster Volunteers from Aster Al Raffah Sohar conducted a health awareness session on work ergonomics for 40 Civil Defense employees.

The programs were organized at various locations including the Sohar Festival Health Station, Muscat Nights Festival, and at the Ministry of Housing, Towell Enhance, Oman Air Corporate, and the PDO Wadilatham site. Beyond health screenings, the initiative prioritized professional development and safety through a Nursing Symposium Presentation on poly-trauma and a specialized Ergonomics Session for Civil Defense. By combining first-aid support with advanced health education, continuing to strengthen its commitment to the well-being and safety of the Omani community.

Aster Volunteers from the UAE and India conducted a high-impact Basic Life Support (BLS) Awareness Training Session at Ganpat University, Mehsana, Gujarat. Led by a cross-border team of medical experts, the program was designed to equip future healthcare professionals with the critical skills required to manage cardiac and respiratory emergencies through a rigorous, multi-modal curriculum.

The intensive session provided hands-on training for over 200 nursing faculty and final-year students, utilizing a hybrid model of video-based online modules, theoretical assessments, and practical drills. By enabling spot certification for participants through mail and whatsapp as first responders, the initiative creates a sustainable "awareness ecosystem", ensuring life-saving knowledge continues to proliferate throughout the university campus.
